Why the Accelerated Bridge Program?

- Graduate credits at the undergraduate cost
- Save time in degree completion
- Get a step ahead towards your continued graduate work

Bachelors to Master Accelerated Bridge Program: Students from the specified Bachelors majors can bridge into the Master Degree Programs and take up to 12 credits from their Bachelors program towards completion of a Masters degree.

Masters to Doctoral Accelerated Bridge Program: M.A. students intending to apply to UI&U's Ph.D. program may take one or two doctoral level courses (ACS 700 Critical Writing and Thinking I; FNDS 702 Ethics and Social Justice) in place of M.A. courses (525/526, Applications I and II while paying M.A. tuition. The Ph.D. courses would be taken in the final phase of the M.A. program, just prior to beginning work on the thesis. The courses would appear on the transcript as Ph.D. courses and would count toward the Ph.D. program at UI&U. Because of the cost difference between M.A. and Ph.D. tuition, this can have the effect of a scholarship of more than two thousand dollars.
