About the U4U! Program: U4U! Early College Program (U4U! ECP) is a 2-year, "dual enrollment," program designed for qualifying junior and senior high school students. U4U! ECP serves as a bridge to successfully and effectively educate "U!" (our student), while transitioning into post-secondary education via a combination of distance-learning tools, virtual classrooms and our team of Success Coaches.

Requirements: In order to be eligible for enrollment in the U4U! ECP, prospective students must have an overall high school grade point average (GPA) of 3.0, or, complete an online Accuplacer test for consideration. This test will be administered online by UI&U. Students enrolled in the U4U! ECP are considered Union Institute & University undergraduate students and are bound by the same guidelines and regulations as any other UI&U undergraduate student.
